Dear Parents & Students,

The end of the school year in nearly upon us and we have a very different run-in this year compared to any previous year. With the onset of your summer holidays, we would like to acknowledge and congratulate all our CBC students, their parents and families and all the CBC staff for their patience, on-line participation and engagement to date. We are all adapting to our new learning environment and missing school as we knew it. The past few months have shown us that schools are much more than places where information is passed on. Schools are about relationships, connections and experiences. We remember that some families in our school community are mourning the loss of loved ones from the COVID-19 virus. As the Covid-19 global pandemic continues, the restrictions on mobility created by physical distancing have impacted on education at all levels. In all likelihood movement limitations and mobility restrictive measures will disrupt life and school-based education for several more months. The main strategy available to prevent the rapid spread of infections is likely to consist of social/physical distancing. In CBC, we are currently considering various plans aimed at developing adaptive, coherent, effective and equitable measures for the continuation of education through traditional and possible alternative methods. Many students and parents are asking about next year but that is all to be worked out yet – please be assured that CBC will communicate with you during the summer and when we know more. Summer Exams – Good Luck!



We have always believed that an end of year focus for our students was crucial in maintaining their engagement in these unprecedented times. We believe that our students should have an opportunity to

demonstrate their learning achievements and progress to date. All exams are of one hour's duration and students will have 30 minutes following the end of each exam to submit a photo of their work to the Google Classroom Assignment pertaining to the teacher/subject concerned.

We greatly appreciate your kind support in the running of these exams. We fully acknowledge that there may well be some challenges in holding them in busy households where other family members are engaged online as well. In order to refocus the literacy and hand-writing skills of our students, we require the hand-written scripts to be returned to the school in the stamped-addressed envelope enclosed in each exam pack. We would ask that you keep all the exams in a secure place at home and distribute them at the appointed exam timetabled times (the timetable is on the school's website). The completed scripts can then be returned in one bundle via the stamped-addressed envelope or dropped into the school from Monday June 1st. There will be a special delivery box outside the school reception building in CBC from 10am on Monday June 1st. Please get the exams back to the school quickly and ensure that your son's name is on everything that is handed back to the school.

Access to the School

During Phase 1 of the Roadmap for Re-opening Society and Business, CBC will be open from Monday May 18th strictly by prior appointment only, for staff to access materials for the organisation of remote learning. The introduction of the phased measures at Phase 1 allows for arrangements to be put in place for the control of population density onsite in CBC in order to facilitate social distancing and reduce the risk of transmission of the disease. If your son requires access to the school during the next few weeks (e.g. access to the lockers), please ring the school in advance on 01-2805854 and schedule a time with the school secretary. Please note the guidelines below prior to your scheduled access.

Phase 1 Government Roadmap: Access to the school	At present teachers, SNAs and staff members have been identified as those personnel who will have access at Phase 1.	
Assess: High Risk	Any persons who are in the higher risk demographic should not be entering the premises (example employees who are cocooning; self-isolating).	
Entry/Exit to school building	To ensure safe access and egress, there should be one point of entry/exit to the school during this time. In CBC we are using the main door at reception.	
Log-IN and Log- OUT	A log will be kept of those entering/leaving the premises, date, time, etc. to comply with current obligations under employer's and occupier's liability and for contact tracing purposes.	
Social distancing	Personnel who are present in the school are required to practice appropriate social distancing and keep a distance of 2 meters from each other. This applies to meet and greet situations; meetings; coffee break, staff room etc.	
Hygiene	No handshakes. Hand sanitizer will be made available at the point of entry/exit or staff may wish to wash their hands after entering the building. Staff are asked to minimise common touch areas e.g. handles, key pads, kettles, copiers, lifts etc., No sharing of pens etc.	
Covid-19	All personnel should perform regular and thorough hand hygiene
